

## RESEARCH OUTPUT GUIDELINES - PRESENTATIONS

---

### 1. Purpose

The following guidelines are applicable to the development and delivery of presentations for research projects awarded by the Institute for Safety, Compensation and Recovery Research (ISCRR).

### 2. Background

ISCRR no longer requires researchers to utilise a standard ISCRR template when developing presentations from ISCRR funded research projects. Researchers are to use their own University/Faculty/School templates to present research findings for projects awarded through the Institute. Presentations are to be delivered to ISCRR for ISCRR and partner review, allowing 20 working days for this review and comment prior to final submission/presentation at conferences.

### 3. Relevant to

All researchers who have been awarded funding through ISCRR.

### 4. Research presentation guidelines

Presentations derived from research awarded through the Institute are subject to the publications policy and the following requirements:

1. **Cover/title slide** – The first page should serve as a cover page of the report that states clearly:
  - a. Report title
  - b. Full name of author(s)
  - c. Month and year of submission
  - d. Chief investigator's institute logo
  - e. Research report number [please provide space for ISCRR to fill in]
2. **Acknowledgement** - Researchers are required to acknowledge ISCRR and its funders for research projects that are funded through ISCRR. Researchers may use own words to add any other acknowledgments as appropriate. The acknowledgement section should include the ISCRR and funder logos and include one of the following paragraphs:

**TAC Funded** - *This project is funded by the Transport Accident Commission, through the Institute for Safety, Compensation and Recovery Research. The Institute for Safety, Compensation and Recovery Research is a joint initiative of the Transport Accident Commission, WorkSafe Victoria and Monash University.*

**WorkSafe Funded** - *This project is funded by WorkSafe Victoria, through the Institute for Safety, Compensation and Recovery Research. The Institute for Safety, Compensation and Recovery Research is a joint initiative of the Transport Accident Commission, WorkSafe Victoria and Monash University.*

**Both TAC and WorkSafe Funded** - *This project is funded by WorkSafe Victoria and the Transport*

*Accident Commission, through the Institute for Safety, Compensation and Recovery Research. The Institute for Safety, Compensation and Recovery Research is a joint initiative of the Transport Accident Commission, WorkSafe Victoria and Monash University.*

3. **Presentation content** - as desired (applicable to the audience) however when presenting to funding partners researchers are to ensure the content is focussed towards the findings and implications rather than the methods. Presentations should be clear and concise and provide implications or ways the funding partners could potentially utilise the findings.
